Both at school as well as at home

Duration: 12 teaching hours plus some more at home

MAIN OBJECTIVES

- The main objective of the project was to stimulate a class with potential, but of high levels of misbehavior, disobedience and indifference to almost all subjects, to work simultaneously on two languages, the one they speak and the one they are being taught.
- Another important goal was to think of languages not as independent units existing in different countries, but as mutually connected through vocabulary, both lent and borrowed.
- Last but not least, it was a chance to start watching English documentaries, as well as any kind of show, from another perspective. It is widely acknowledged that children spend too much time in front of screens. So, why not make the best out of it!

DESCRIPTION OF THE PROCESS

- We dealt with five YouTube videos which comprised parts of documentaries shown on the History Channel.
- Firstly, we watched one of them in class and tried to spot English words deriving from Greek with the help of subtitles.
- Then, four teams were formed by the students and each team had to follow the same procedure with one of the other videos. Every student was sent the assigned video via email so that they could work at home.
- Next, every team presented their findings in class. The whole class watched
 the video which was to be presented and they were given a challenge: to
 find as many words as possible on the spot before the team responsible for
 the particular video reveals them all.

DESCRIPTION OF THE PROCESS

- Finally, I completed the list with words they hadn't found, making them suspicious of the fact that there might be words coming from the Greek language that are not particularly profound. There were times when my students reached even further than me and pointed out words I hadn't thought of!
- We went on observing the presence of Greek words in the English vocabulary by getting to know who Mr. Zolotas was and how he gave not one but two speeches consisting of such words.
- Likewise, some of the students produced similar sentences or even whole paragraphs.

DESCRIPTION OF THE PROCESS

- To be sure of the fact that the use of words of Greek origin is an acknowledged global phenomenon and not our homeland-friendly impression, we searched the internet, and we found people talking about the importance of our language.
- We concluded our project by playing with the words we had found, making word art images. Using the AI program named SUNO, I wrote a song consisting both of words included in our project as well as others. Luckily enough, it came out as I had imagined it!
- Thanks to the teacher of the 6th grade, who recorded the students presenting the project and combined the audio with my slides, we ended up with a short movie which can be found in YouTube.


RESULTS

- Students were motivated to watch a program with a more critical eye.
- Even students not participating in the actual project, had something to say while working in class.
- A project covering several aspects, including from scientific terminology to controversial everyday words, such as Ok!
- Presentation of the project at the end of the school year celebration.
- A movie uploaded on YouTube including the actual PowerPoint combined with audio of the students presenting the whole project.








• The history of anthropology has got a plethora of mysterious phenomena. The cosmos, full of energetic spheres, called planets and forming galaxies, is gigantic.



SO...IS EVERYTHING O.K.?

- Ok, or okay, is one of the most frequently used words in the English language, but does it have a Greek origin?
- One theory on the etymology of OK is that it was originally an acronym for the Greek phrase "óla kalá" (ὁλα καλά), meaning "all good."
- A theory suggested that OK can be the abbreviation of the Greek words Ola Kala. It means everything is fine. There is another theory that suggests that Choctaw, a Native American tribe, originally from the contemporary Southeast United States, has a word called 'Okeh'. It means that 'so it is'.
